### IMPACT REPORT 2023

2023 was a busy year for MAYA. We created a new mission statement, centering our work with racially marginalized populations. We hired our first dedicated fundraiser. And we relaunched mental health services in Allegheny County Jail. This report provides a snapshot of these and other successes, and a taste of what we do at MAYA and why. We hope that you enjoy learning about what moves us - and perhaps you will decide to join us as we work for better birth experiences and outcomes for Pittsburgh's marginalized communities.



#### **ACHIEVEMENTS**

In April, MAYA created and adopted new mission, vision, and values statements (which you can read on page 5).

A year ago, we hired our first development director.

We brought our mental health care services back into Allegheny County Jail, after an absence of over two years.

And we signed a contract to provide prenatal and doula services in Allegheny County Jail.

We received a Highmark Bright Blue Futures Award for our work to address the social determinants of health.

Our director of civic engagement, Amber Edmunds, co-founded the Shanga Collective, a group of organizations working for equity and protections for Black birthworkers.

We built and launched a new website (check it out at the same address, mayaorganization.org).

We began participating in Allegheny Health Network's First Steps & Beyond project to respond to racial disparities in maternal infant outcomes.

MAYA participated in the Pittsburgh: A Safer Childbirth City initiative and Perinatal Health Equity Champions, collaborating with community partners to improve racial disparities in maternal-infant outcomes.

We signed a contract to provide professional training on obstetric racism to providers in the Allegheny Health Network, thus launching our fee-for-service training program.

And finally, MAYA was selected to appear in the Pittsburgh Foundation's Wish Book.




## WHO DOES MAYA SERVE? A DEMOGRAPHIC BREAKDOWN OF OUR PERINATAL CLIENTS





## MAYA's Mission, Vision, and Values

Adopted April, 2023

**MAYA's MISSION** is to empower BIPOC and marginalized birthing people and birthworkers, and to create positive change in the systems that impact them.

#### **VISION**

At MAYA we envision a city without disparities in maternal and infant outcomes: one in which all birthing people are empowered, supported, and celebrated as they take on the transformative task of giving birth and raising a new life. We aspire to a future where the experiences and interests of birthing people of color are centered, and where birthworkers are supported and recognized for their critical role in the community.

#### **VALUES**

**Our services are accessible.** All pregnant and new parents are welcome to participate in our programs. MAYA requires little to no documentation. We offer services online and in community locations.

**Our services are holistic.** MAYA sees parents as whole people with physical, emotional, social, informational, and practical needs. Our scope of practice includes professional and peer support, fact-based information, and practical assistance. Within this scope, we do not limit our services to specific topics or situations.

We are community-based. Whenever possible, care is facilitated by mentors that live in the same communities as our participants. Although MAYA provides fact-based information when needed, we do not see ourselves as bearers of information to be handed down to participants. Rather, we provide a community of care in which participants contribute their insights and experiences as equals.

It's not about us. We recognize that each of us has our own opinions, beliefs, and values, and we can never be completely unbiased. At MAYA, we work to be aware of our own biases so that we can set them aside and focus on the participants' point of view. Our only agenda is to assist participants in making their own decisions that are in alignment with their own values.

We are an anti-racist space. We acknowledge and talk about racial disparities in birth outcomes. MAYA strives to understand the ways that historical and current systemic racism negatively affect the health and experiences of Black and Brown birthing people. We work actively to center Black experiences and provide culturally-congruent support. We examine the impact that our hiring practices, client interactions, and organizational culture have on people of color.

**Our services are trauma-informed.** We understand that traumatic experiences can alter participants' sense of danger and complicate the work of healing, and we work to create a community of safety. Our staff are trained to provide trauma-informed care.

**We care about relationships.** Relationships are at the core of our work: relationships with participants, partner organizations, and medical providers. MAYA works actively to build trusting relationships with all these groups because change only happens when we work together.

**We believe in human dignity.** MAYA serves incarcerated individuals, people struggling with addiction, and women who have faced abuse and loss - individuals who are often stigmatized, or even dehumanized. We stand against stigma and shame, and uphold the dignity of all people, no matter what their circumstances.


